Project Location - N. Sunset Road on Red Mountain in Benton City, WA Mountain States is proud to announce the completion of the new Fidelitas Winery. This new winery is a modern shed design that was the creation of the owners working through an architect out of Seattle. The slightly over 2,900 sf facility hosts a cellar and case goods storage room, a barrel storage room, bottling area, lab, public restrooms and a tasting area. The facility sits on a tract of land overlooking the Benton City valley below. It has round outdoor concrete patios with a BBQ area and an outdoor fireplace. The interior boasts chip board paneling on the walls stained in both red and white colors. Travis Glenn and his crew worked almost entirely through the project off of generators because permanent power had to be brought into the site and that was quite a lengthy process.


OLSEN ESTATES WINERY - Prosser, WA PM - Chad Null | Superintendent - Scott Carlson

Mountain States has wrapped up construction on the Olsen Estates winery locaed in the North Prosser Business Park in Prosser. The winery consists of a full production facility, tasting room, kitchen, and administrative offices. The winery is capable of complete wine production and entertaining. The tasting room finishes consist of exposed timber trusses with exposed tongue and groove ceilings, a full stone masonry fireplace and stained concrete floors. The exterior of the winery is done

in a stucco wall finish system and masonry tile roofing and exposed wood framed pergolas.

SELAH WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY - Selah, WA PM - Mike Thelen | Superintendent - Jerry Garza

The Selah WWTP project is off and running great. MSCC broke ground early last December with Jerry Garza at the helm. We encountered quite a problem at the start of this project trying to find an area to dispense of the high ground water table. The



water table is around 3 feet below ground surface and with the clarifier structure around 17 feet deep we had to remove the ground water down to approximately 20 feet below ground surface.



MSCC went to work right away assembling a dewatering system to pump this water out of the ground to a discharge location. The Engineers originally said we could discharge the water to a nearby swamp but after pumping less than 24 hours we were told to turn off the pumps because we were starting to flood the golf course next door. After two more unsuccessful attempts the Engineers finally got approval to discharge the water into the nearby Selah creek. Completion of this project is set for late October 2007.

LONG SHADOWS WINERY - Walla Walla, WA PM - Chad Null | Superintendent - Lee Rath

The 29,715 sf facility is constructed of concrete tilt panels inside and out. The main floor of the facility is used for case goods storage, barrel rooms, tank room, lab, staging, and office space. The mezzanine of the facility

contains a conference room with fireplace, a staging kitchen, wine display, and veranda all for private events. The west side of the facility is buried 22' of its 28' height into the hillside with the south face buried 11' hiding the large size of the facility. Design & Construction by Mountain States.

SUNNYSIDE COMMUNITY HOSPITAL ER REMODEL Sunnyside, WA

Construction is underway on the first phase of the 7,000 sf emergency care wing. This project doubles the size of the existing emergency area. Once complete it will provide six private treatment rooms, several exam rooms, two major care trauma rooms and a minor care treatment area. In addition the new facility will have separate entrances for the public and ambulances. We are scheduled to complete the first phase mid July and the overall project completion will take place near December 1st. Q and his hospital crew have done a great job in meeting the demands of this project.

Construction is under way on an additional barrel room for Maryhill Winery. The facility when completed will be 8,400sf and will allow Maryhill to produce 60,000 cases. Concrete tilt up construction was used for this project. The exterior of the barrel room will have an acrylic stucco



finish system to match the existing winery. John Hanson and his crew have done a great job at keeping this project on schedule.

The new Mercer Wine Estates has been designed to produce up to 65,000 cases of wine. The facility is made up of a 9,500 sf tank room with concrete tank pads, a 6,600 sf case goods storage, bottling, and mechanical room, a concrete



truck loading dock with ramp, and a 4,100 sf crush slab. There are a total of 35 insulated sandwich panels that make up this facility. The average panel size is 19' wide and 35' tall. Scott and his crew are working hard and will have the facility ready for this year's crush. production Once the building is complete, Mountain States will start work on the barrel and



tasting facility for Mercer Wine Estates.
